## Guest Column:

As possible, & as room allows, The Castro Lion Roar is accepting Guest Columns from our local non-profit partners & neighbors. Some of these are current or former beneficiaries, all are friends of the Castro & worth your consideration.

This month I am pleased to share some information with you from UCSF – AHP – the University of California SF – AIDS Health Project.

UCSF AIDS Health Project wishes to acknowledge all the support the Castro Lions Club has given us over the years, most recently sponsoring the Richmond/Ermet AIDS Foundation's Help is On the Way variety show in August. The AIDS Health Project (AHP) was one of the three beneficiary agencies for that dazzling event, which raised more than \$25,000 for AHP!

Another event is on the way: we hope that Castro Lion members will join us this year at our annual Gala on Nov. 15. This year, the Gala is different: in honor of our 20th Anniversary of service, we are taking over the Castro Theater & putting on a variety show.

The Gala has always been a time for AHP to acknowledge & thank our supporters & friends, to look to the future, & to reaffirm our commitment to people with HIV struggling to remain healthy & to people in our community struggling to remain uninfected. 20 years of your support & 20 years of struggling deserve a reaffirmation of similar proportions, & we are planning a Night to Remember.

The AIDS Health Project is the leading HIV-related mental health agency in San Francisco & has been so since 1984, when it helped to pioneer the San Francisco Model of Care. Over the course of 20 years, AHP has provided HIV prevention, education & counseling services to literally hundreds of thousands of men, women, & young people, & education & mentoring to their medical & mental health providers.

Over the years, AHP has pioneered a variety of programs that have become national models. Among these programs are: educational support groups to facilitate HIV-related behavior change, psychiatric services for people with HIV disease, AIDS prevention & risk reduction strategies targeting people who use substances, anonymous & confidential antibody testing, & among the first training & publications programs for professionals who work with HIV.

AHP currently provides direct services to more than 10,000 clients annually. AHP has always had a presence in the Castro & other areas

hardest hit by the epidemic, but this year we acknowledge another milestone; seven years at our own building; the AHP Services Center. Being at 1930 Market Street has ensured the accessibility of our services & the stability of our presence in the community. This is crucial since we offer an array of services ranging from more than 30 support groups a week to individual counseling & crisis intervention.

Our HIV antibody counseling & testing program alone has delivered test results—and the crucial counseling that accompanies them—to more than 170,000 people &, throughout California. We have also trained more than 50,000 health care professionals, educators, & students to perform “client-centered” HIV test counseling.

Our REACH Program (Risk Evaluation & Counseling for Health) offers support groups, workshops, & counseling on HIV prevention & health & well being for HIV-negative & untested gay & bisexual men & their partners. Counseling focuses on issues such as sex & intimacy, sexual negotiation, alcohol & drug use, relationships (including mixed HIV status relationships), isolation, community, coming out, & self-esteem.

Our Psychological Support Services for people with HIV offers support groups & counseling services for individuals confronting the range of issues related to living with HIV; including considering work, dealing with depression, negotiating sex, handling loss & grief, being in relationships, & resolving isolation & homophobia

Most AHP services are free. There is a sliding scale for some services, but no one is turned away for inability to pay. For more information on AHP services, call 415-476-6448 (TTY: 415-476-3587) or go to our web site: [www.ucsf-ahp.org](http://www.ucsf-ahp.org) .

AHP is a non-profit agency operating within University of California San Francisco, but we receive no programmatic funding from the university. The bulk of our funding comes from individual & corporate support as well as foundation grants & contracts from federal, state, & city governments. We receive some funding through donations from clients.

We also depend on the support of volunteers to multiply our funding & extend effective services to thousands of clients. AHP has a paid staff of 110 full & part-time employees, and a volunteer staff of 300 who we train, supervise & support.

After 20 years, AHP's longevity can be attributed to our ability to anticipate & adapt to the changing needs of people living with HIV & AIDS & people at risk for infection. It can also be attributed to the participation of volunteers & supporters from groups like the Castro Lions &

the Richmond Ermet Foundation. "Thank you" is not enough to express our gratitude for 20 years of your service, but we hope it is a good placeholder for an appreciation that cannot be articulated with words.

**Editor's PROUD Note:** at the AHP Center 1930 Market, there are several Castro Lions name-tiles embedded in the Wall of Honor for their contribution to the work of the agency. Your editor is also proud to have the 2nd floor class room used constantly by the agency named for his AHP support of their work over the years.
